Game Notes

The Setting

Iowa (18-9, 7-7) closes the regular season by hosting Wisconsin (17-9, 8-7) this afternoon in sold out Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa will participate in the Big Ten Conference Tournament next week, March 8-11, at the United Center in Chicago, IL.

Iowa Senior Day

The senior members of Iowa's basketball program will be recognized following today's contest against Wisconsin. Following the contest, Coach Steve Alford will introduce the seniors, who will then have the opportunity to speak to the crowd. Iowa's senior players include Dean Oliver and Jason Smith.

On the Air

Radio: Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play with color commentator Bob Hansen. **Television:** Today's game can be seen throughout the Big Ten Conference viewing area as part of ESPN's regional Weekend Package. Wayne Larrivee and Greg Kelsner will call the action.

In the Ratings

Iowa is 37th in the Sagarin Ratings and Iowa's schedule to date is ranked as the 13th strongest among all Division I teams. The RPI Ratings rank Iowa 29th and Iowa's schedule strength is ranked 28th. Iowa has been ranked as high as 14th this season (twice in the AP poll), a ranking that is the highest reached by a Steve Alford coached team and the highest for Iowa since being ranked 12th during the 1999 season. Iowa has appeared in the national rankings 21 consecutive seasons, a streak that ranks seventh best in the nation.

Iowa History

Prior to hosting Penn State Thursday, Iowa had played 2,207 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Overall Iowa's record is 1,318-889 (.597). That includes an 823-287 (.741) record in home games, a 495-602 (.451) record in games away from Iowa City, a 636-615 (.508) mark in Big Ten games and a 229-61 (.790) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa in Carver-Hawkeye Arena

Iowa first played in Carver-Hawkeye Arena Jan. 5, 1983. Iowa has compiled a 229-61 (.790) record in the arena. Iowa is 113-52 (.685) in Big Ten games and 116-9 (.928) in non-Big Ten games. Iowa has drawn over four million fans for men's basketball games since the arena opened in 1983 and the Hawkeyes have won 17 straight non-conference home games. The numbers above do not include the Thursday night contest vs. Penn State.

Iowa Coach Steve Alford

Steve Alford (pronounced ALL-ford) is in his second season as the head coach at the University of Iowa and his 10th season as a college head coach. Alford, 36, has a career record of 188-102 (.648), including a 32-25 (.561) record at Iowa, a 78-29 (.729) record in four seasons (1992-95) at Division III Manchester College and a four-year record (1996-99) of 78-48 (.619) at Southwest Missouri State. Alford led Southwest to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1999 and in 1995 Manchester advanced to the NCAA championship game before suffering its first defeat of the season. Alford this past fall was inducted into the Manchester College M Association Hall of Fame.

Alford is a 1987 graduate of Indiana, where he led the Hoosiers to the 1987 NCAA title. Alford was a member of the 1984 U. S. Olympic team that earned the Gold Medal and he was the 26th player selected in the NBA Draft following his senior season. Alford played four seasons in the NBA before beginning his coaching career.

At Indiana Alford started 120 of 125 games in four seasons. He served as team captain in 1987 when the Hoosiers were 30-4. Steve concluded his college career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points. He was a consensus first team All-American and the Big Ten MVP as a senior and in 1997 he was inducted into the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame.

Alford is 2-2 vs. Wisconsin and 0-1 vs. Badger Coach Brad Soderberg.

Wisconsin's Brad Soderberg

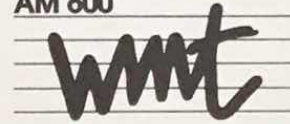
Brad Soderberg is in his first year as Wisconsin's head coach, taking over the team when Dick Bennett announced his retirement three games into this season. Soderberg has led Wisconsin to an 15-8 record, and his career mark is 130-71. Soderberg is in his sixth season on the Wisconsin staff. Prior to this season, Soderberg posted a 115-63 record as a head coach, including a 36-18 record in two seasons at South Dakota State and a 79-45 mark in five seasons at Loras College in Dubuque, IA. Soderberg has been an assistant coach at Loras, Wisconsin-Stevens Point, Colorado State and Ft. Hays State (KS). Soderberg played for Dick Bennett at Wisconsin-Stevens Point, where he was a team captain in 1984 when Stevens Point finished as NAIA national runner-up. Soderberg is 1-0 vs. Iowa and Hawkeye Coach Steve Alford.

The Series

Iowa holds a 73-61 advantage in the series that began with a 30-9 Wisconsin win in 1909. The teams split two games last season, but Wisconsin has won four of the last five meetings, including a 67-54 victory earlier this season in Madison. Iowa holds a 46-19 advantage in games played in Iowa City and a 12-4 record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, but the Badgers have won two straight in Iowa City. Wisconsin has not won three straight games at Iowa since winning here in 1912, 1916 and 1918 in the first three games the Badgers played in Iowa City. In the only game between the two teams played at a neutral site, Wisconsin defeated Iowa 74-60 in the 1999 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago.

Wisconsin Rallied Past Iowa

Iowa got off to a fast start by scoring the first eight points of the game, but Wisconsin controlled the final 10 minutes of the contest and earned a 67-54 win over the Hawkeyes Jan. 16 in Madison. After Iowa scored the first four points of the second half to build a 33-25 advantage, Wisconsin's defense took its toll. The Hawkeyes scored just 21 points over the final 17 minutes, while Wisconsin scored 42 points to win going away.

The Badgers took their first lead of the game at 38-37 with 10:33 remaining, and Iowa never led again. The Hawkeyes shot just 35% from the field in the second half and made just 60% of their free throws, both in the second half and for the game. Wisconsin, on the other hand, shot 47% from the field in the final 20 minutes and added 22-27 (81.5%) free throws. For the game, the Badgers outscored Iowa 29-12 from the free throw line, while Iowa won the rebounding battle by a 33-26 margin.

Young Iowa Facing Veteran Teams

Iowa is closing the season against a veteran team that features an experienced group of seniors. Wisconsin features a starting line-up that

includes four seniors. Three of those four, Mike Kelley, Andy Kownke and Mark Vershaw, have all played in 125 consecutive games together.

Iowa, on the other hand, has started three true freshmen in its last four games. While senior Dean Oliver has started 117 of Iowa's 119 games over the past four years, the Iowa roster features nine players who are members of the Hawkeye squad for the first time this season.

Games Notes

Iowa's Steve Alford holds a 10-2 record vs. Wisconsin as a player and coach. Indiana won eight games vs. Wisconsin during Alford's playing career. As a coach, Alford is 2-2 vs. the Badgers. Alford's Southwest Missouri State team defeated Wisconsin in the first round of the 1999 NCAA Tournament and Wisconsin has won two of the three meetings in the last two seasons.

Wisconsin Coach Brad Soderberg was previously an assistant, and later the head coach, at Loras College in Dubuque, IA.

At the start of the season, both the Iowa coaching staff and the staff at Wisconsin had a father-son combination. Sam Alford, the father of Iowa Coach Steve Alford, is an assistant coach. At Wisconsin, Tony Bennett is in his first year as an assistant coach, joining the staff when his father was the Badger head coach.

Evans Sets Free Throw Marks

Junior forward Reggie Evans has established a new Iowa record for free throw attempts in a season with 279, breaking a mark that ranked as the fourth oldest individual record in Iowa's record books. The previous mark of 268 was set by Don Nelson during a 24-game season in 1961. Evans established Carver-Hawkeye Arena records for free throws made (16) and attempted (22) in Iowa's overtime win over Purdue Feb. 21. Those figures rank as the fourth best totals ever for a single game at Iowa.

Leading his Iowa squad against one of the most demanding schedules in the nation, Steve Alford and his first Hawkeye basketball team gave Iowa fans plenty to cheer about during the 2000 season. And, numerous reasons to look to the future with anticipation.

The Alford era here at the University of Iowa began in impressive fashion, as the Hawks scored a 70-68 win over Connecticut in the season opener. The win over the top-ranked Huskies, the defending NCAA champion, came in New York City's Madison Square Garden in front of a national audience.

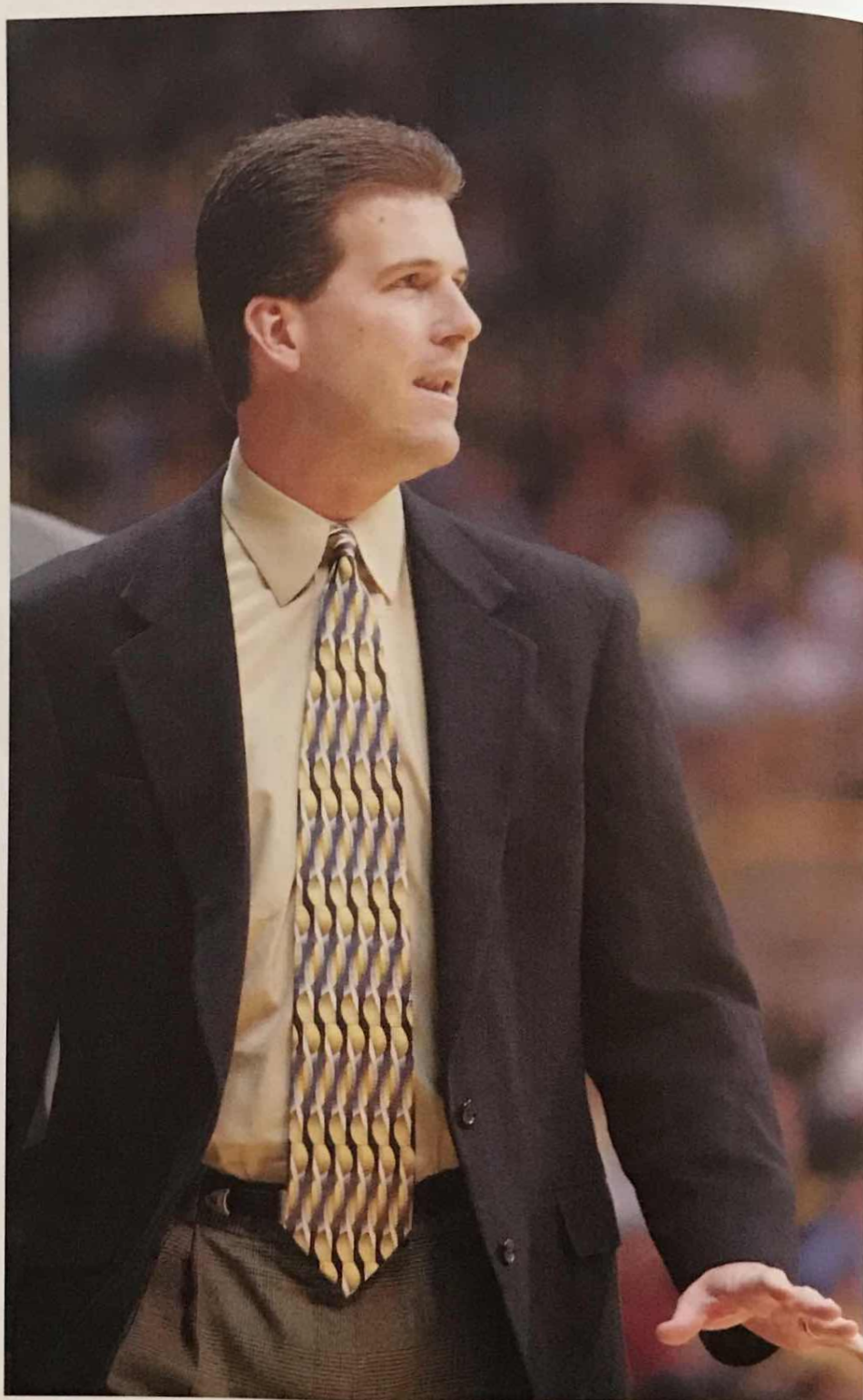
While the 14-16 overall record isn't what Alford and his staff had hoped for at the beginning of the season, you don't have to look very hard to see that a solid foundation for Iowa's future has been formed.

Along with the season-opening win over Connecticut, Iowa also defeated fifth-ranked Ohio State in Columbus and 15th-ranked Kansas in Iowa City. Overall, Iowa posted a 3-7 record while playing 10 of 30 games against nationally ranked opponents.

Alford was named head men's basketball coach at the University of Iowa in March of 1999, and immediately had a decisive impact on the Iowa program. Season ticket sales increased as Carver-Hawkeye Arena was sold out for 11 of 13 games. Iowa's average attendance for home games was the highest since 1996 and student ticket sales more than doubled from the previous season.

Alford's presence on the Iowa sidelines has brought national attention to the Hawkeyes, not just because of wins over some of the most established basketball programs in the nation, but also because Alford is recognized as one of the brightest young coaching stars in college basketball today.

Throughout the season Alford and the Iowa basketball program were featured on television specials on ESPN, CNN/SI, Fox Sports Net and HBO Sports, and in sports sections in major daily newspapers around the nation.





78-29 record in four seasons at Division III Manchester College and a four-year record of 78-48 at Southwest Missouri State. The Bears in 1999 defeated Wisconsin and Tennessee to advance to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament before losing to top-ranked Duke in the regional semi-finals. The trip to the Sweet 16 was the first ever for Southwest Missouri State. Alford's best record at Southwest Missouri State came in 1997 when the Bears were 24-9 and advanced to the National Invitation Tournament.

The Bears began 1998-99 with wins at Butler and Missouri before a loss to second-ranked Stanford in the pre-season NIT. Texas-Christian, with a two-point win, marked the only other non-conference loss for the Bears. Southwest Missouri State was 11-7 in league play, suffering four losses by three points or less and another in two overtimes. The Bears finished second in the MVC in 1999 and 1997, third in 1998 and fourth in 1996.

Alford was named head coach at Southwest Missouri State prior to the 1995-96 season and he led the Bears to a 16-12 mark in his first season at the Division I level. The Bears were 24-9 overall in his second season and tied for second in the Missouri Valley Conference. The following season Southwest overcame a slow start by winning 12 of its final 18 games, posting a final record of 16-16 while advancing to the title game of the MVC post-season tournament for the second straight season.

Alford joined the collegiate coaching ranks in 1992 at Manchester College (Indiana), taking over a team that had lost its first eight games. After winning four of 20 games that season, Alford led the school to a 20-8 mark in his first full season.

The following season Manchester was 23-4, and in his fourth and final season, Alford's squad was 31-1. Manchester won conference titles in both 1994 and 1995 and competed in the NCAA Division III Tournament in Alford's final three seasons. Manchester also won three straight conference tournament titles from 1993-95.

Manchester advanced to the Division III championship game in 1995 before suffering its first defeat in 32 games to place second in the nation. Alford was named Indiana Collegiate Conference Coach of the Year in 1993, 1994 and 1995, and his record was 74-13 over his final three seasons.

Alford, 35, is a native of New Castle, Indiana, where he was a prep standout for his father, Sam Alford, at New Castle Chrysler High School. He earned Indiana's Mr. Basketball Award in 1983 after averaging 37.7 points per game as a senior.

In 1984 he earned a gold medal at the Los Angeles Olympic Games and in 1987 he led Indiana to Big Ten Conference and NCAA Tournament championships. He was the 26th selection in the 1987 NBA draft and played four seasons in the NBA before beginning his coaching career.

"We are extremely pleased to introduce Steve Alford as our basketball coach," said Bob Bowlsby, UI Men's Director of Intercollegiate Athletics, in introducing Alford as Iowa's 20th head basketball coach. "Steve is an outstanding individual who has been extremely successful at every level of his basketball career. We feel Steve Alford will provide dynamic and progressive leadership in all facets of our basketball program."

Alford has compiled a nine-year record of 170-93 (.646), including a

In 1999, Alford was inducted into the Manchester College M Association Hall of Fame. In addition, the 1994-95 Manchester College team was also inducted, in recognition of their outstanding season.

Alford began his coaching career after a four-year career in the NBA, spending most of his career with Dallas and a portion of one season with Golden State. Alford scored 744 career points to go with 176 assists and a free throw accuracy of 87 percent over his four seasons. Alford played for former Iowa basketball standout Don Nelson in the NBA.

Along with being named Indiana's Mr. Basketball as a senior, Alford was the FCA Basketball Athlete of the Year and the Converse High School National Player of the Year. Steve's father, Sam, following an outstanding 30-year career as a prep coach, was an assistant coach at Southwest Missouri State for four seasons before joining Steve at the University of Iowa.

During his collegiate career at Indiana, Alford started all but five of 125 games as a Hoosier, helping Indiana post a four-year mark of 92-35. Alford served as team captain in 1987 when Indiana posted a 30-4 overall record, including a split in two games against the Iowa Hawkeyes.

Alford concluded his college career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points and he became the first player to win the Indiana Most Valuable Player award four times. He was a consensus first team all-America selection and the Big Ten Most Valuable Player as a senior. In 1997 he was inducted into the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame.

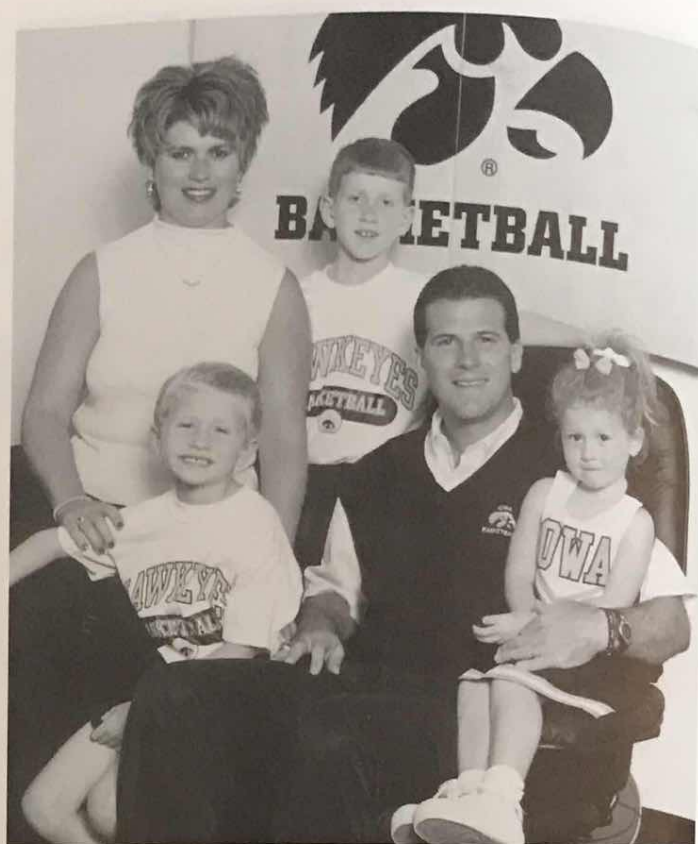
Alford earned first team all-Big Ten honors in each of his final three seasons and also earned all-America honors as a junior. He was named to the NIT all-tourney team as a sophomore when the Hoosiers finished second in that tournament to UCLA. His career free throw percentage of .897 (535-596) ranks fourth best in NCAA history. Alford led the nation in free throw percentage as a freshman at Indiana University.

Alford was named to the all-tournament team at the 1987 Final Four and to the NCAA tournament all-decade team for the 1980s. He set an NCAA Final Four record when he made 7-10 three-point baskets in the 1987 championship game victory over Syracuse.

Following his freshman season at Indiana, Alford was selected to play for the United States basketball team at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles. Alford shot 64.4 percent from the field, averaged 10.3 points per game and was second on the team in assists as the U.S. collegians won the gold medal.

1984 marked the last U.S. amateur team to win the Gold Medal and Alford's teammates included Michael Jordan, Patrick Ewing, Sam Perkins, Chris Mullin and Waymon Tisdale.

Alford was born on November 23, 1964 in Franklin, Indiana. He holds a bachelor's degree in business from Indiana University. Steve is married to the former Tanya Frost. Steve and Tanya have known one another since they were schoolmates in grade school in New Castle. The Alford's have three children: Kory, 8; Bryce, 5; and Kayla, 3.

Sam Alford ASSISTANT COACH

Sam Alford, a highly successful high school coach in the state of Indiana for over 30 years, is in his second year as assistant basketball coach at the University of Iowa. The father of Iowa Head Coach Steve Alford, Sam joined the staff at Iowa after serving as an assistant basketball coach at Southwest Missouri State for four seasons. At Iowa, Sam assists in all areas of the Iowa basketball operation, including on the floor coaching, scouting and recruiting.

After a highly successful career in the prep coaching ranks at New Castle Chrysler High School in New Castle, IN, Sam Alford joined Steve on the staff at Southwest Missouri State prior to the 1996 season.

Sam was the head coach at New Castle HS for 20 seasons, coaching his sons, Steve and Sean. He led New Castle to sectional titles in each of his last eight seasons, regional championships in 1990, 1993 and 1995 and conference titles in 1990 and 1995.

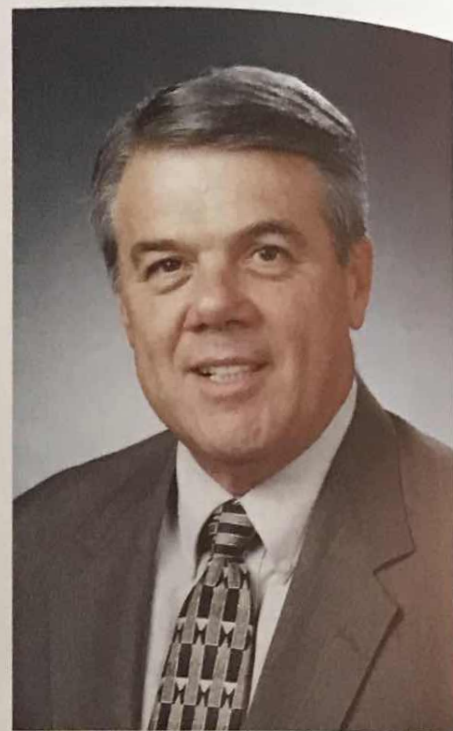
Sam concluded his 20-year stint at New Castle with a record of 300-188 and his

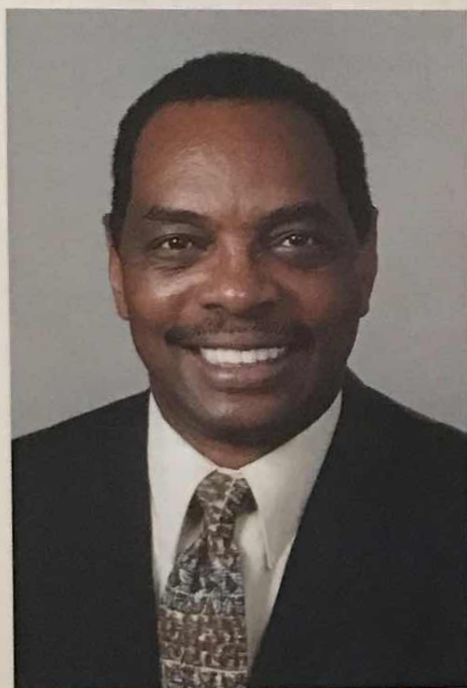

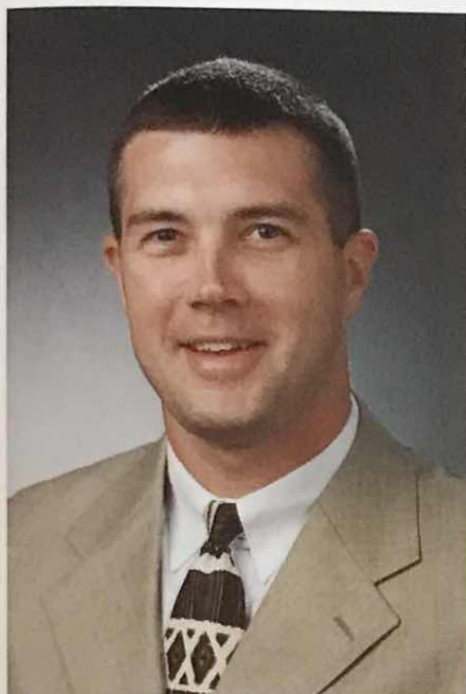

Greg Lansing ASSISTANT COACH



Greg Lansing, a native of Harlan, Iowa, is in his second season as assistant basketball coach at the University of Iowa. Lansing joined the Hawkeye staff after serving as an assistant coach at Indiana State University for four seasons.

In Lansing's final two seasons at Indiana State the Sycamores posted back-to-back winning campaigns for the first time since 1979 and 1980. When the Sycamores posted a 16-11 record in 1998 it marked the first winning season for Indiana State since 1980. In 1999 Indiana State was 15-12, with wins over NCAA participants Creighton and Southwest Missouri State. Indiana State advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2000.

Prior to joining the staff at Indiana State, Lansing was the head basketball coach at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines. In two seasons Lansing posted a 25-19 record, helping the Roughriders post their first winning season in 14 years in his initial season.

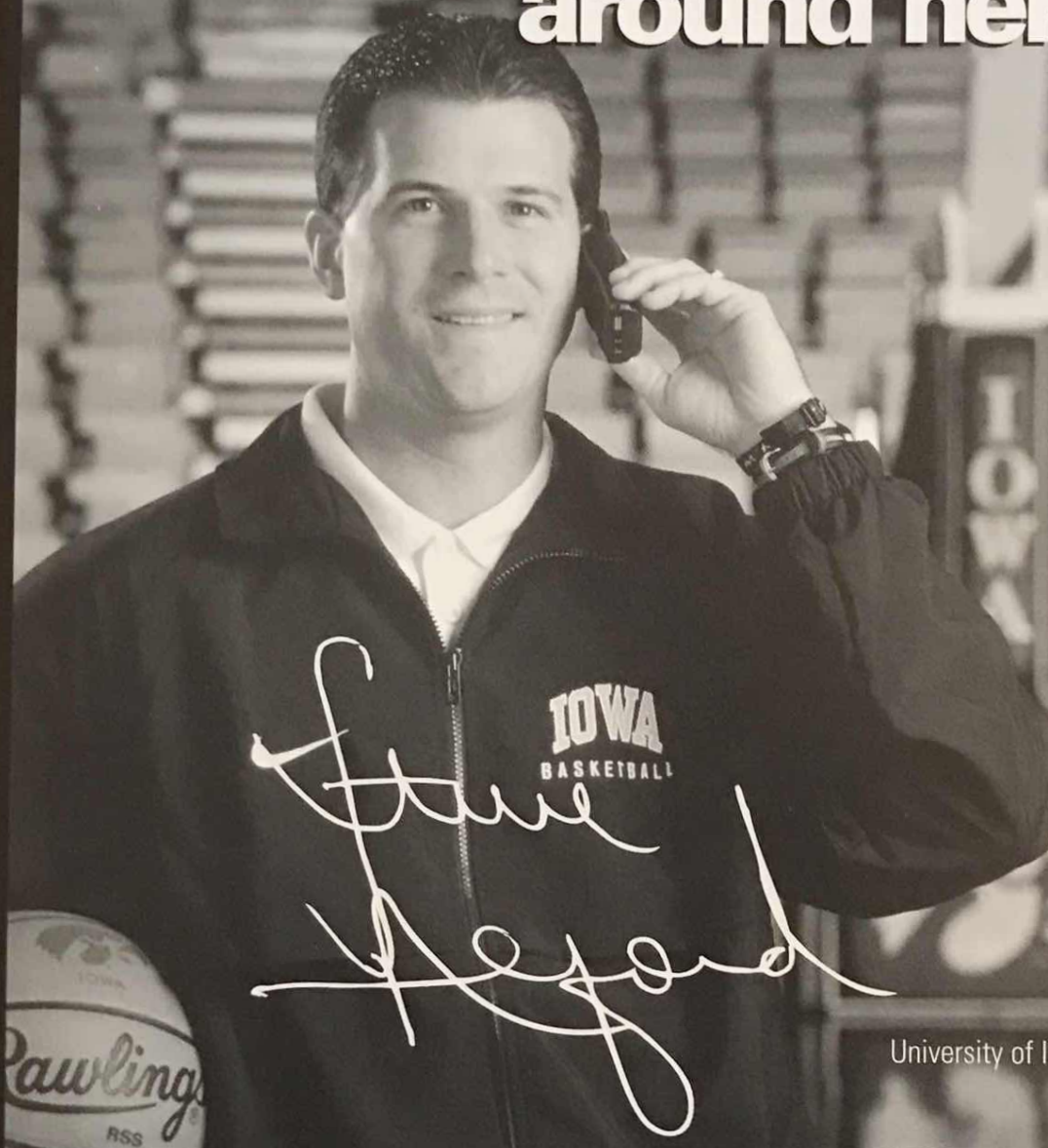

UI EXPERTISE BENEFITS PINT-SIZED MUSEUM PATRONS

Inside the doors of the Iowa Children's Museum, there are lessons to be learned. Kids are testing the effects of friction on the speed of race cars, coping with fractions as they cut a pizza into eight equal pieces, or grouping red items — tomatoes, lobsters, and apples — in just-their-size grocery carts.

And the "big kids," are learning too. Collaborations with the Iowa Children's Museum, whose first of three phases opened in 1999 in Coralville's Coral Ridge Mall, have resulted in hands-on opportunities and challenges for University students, faculty, and staff.

UI collaborators have helped to plan, design, raise funds, build, decorate, and staff the museum, and in the process they've gained

the kind of knowledge that isn't found in many lesson plans.

Expertise and dedication have come from all corners of the University. The food elements of the museum's Pizzeria and City Grocery galleries were developed by Marlys Dunphy, director of dietetic internships at University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics dietetics and her students. Will Swain, a program assistant in biological sciences, is serving as an adviser for a forthcoming beehive and pond exhibit. The artwork around the museum was coordinated by Museum of Art staff member Emily Vermillion, and floating above the "main street" of the museum's Cityworks gallery is a sculpture, *Rainbow in the Sky*, by professor of art and art history, Hu Hung-shu.

Bruce Scherting, an exhibit designer for the UI Museum of Natural History in Machbride

Hall, collaborated with local education specialists before taking on the preliminary designs for the forthcoming Preschool Gallery. He found the experience broadened the scope of his presentations in the museum design course he teaches.

"I'd never had the chance to design exhibits for this age group before — it places different requirements on an exhibit designer," Scherting says.

Graduate student Melvin Smith helped design a racetrack on which kids test the effects of friction on the speed of race cars.

"It's been extremely exciting to take something from the idea stage to seeing kids enjoying and learning from it," Smith says.

Mary Sue Coleman

PRESIDENT OF THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

Mary Sue Coleman, the 18th president of The University of Iowa, holds academic appointments as professor of biochemistry in the College of Medicine and of biological sciences in the College of Liberal Arts.

Coleman has endorsed *Achieving Distinction 2000*, the strategic plan for the University, which lays out a clear aspiration: raising the overall quality of university programs to match those of the ten best public universities in the nation and developing a leadership position in selected areas. Working with faculty and staff, she has articulated core values and indicators of progress for the plan. Coleman believes that the University faces four challenges in the new millennium: providing exposure to an ever more diverse community within the University which will mirror demographic shifts in the workforce; educating students to function in a global economy; helping students to solve problems via multidisciplinary approaches; mastering rapidly changing technologies in and outside of the classroom.

Coleman came to Iowa from the University of New Mexico, where she served as provost and vice president for academic affairs (1993-95). Previously she served as vice chancellor for graduate studies and research (1990-92) at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Among her accomplishments at North Carolina was the revitalization of the Carolina Program for Minority Postdoctoral Scholars, leading to faculty placements at North Carolina and throughout the nation.

Before assuming her duties at North Carolina, Coleman served 19 years as a member of the biochemistry faculty and as a Cancer Center administrator at the University of Kentucky in Lexington. Her research focused on the immune system and malignancies. Her laboratories were continuously funded by the National Institutes of Health for over twenty years.

Coleman was recently appointed to the Knight Foundation Commission on Intercollegiate Athletics, a group that in the 1990's published a series of reports that led to the restructuring of the NCAA. The group is reconvening to take stock of the current state of college athletics.

Coleman was elected to the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences in 1997, and elected as a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science in 2000. She serves on a variety of state and national committees and boards. She is also a trustee of Grinnell College and chair of the Board of Directors of the University of Iowa Health Systems, a nonprofit corporation.



Coleman earned her bachelor's degree in chemistry from Grinnell College and her Ph.D. in biochemistry from the University of North Carolina. She conducted postdoctoral work at North Carolina and at the University of Texas, Austin.

Coleman was born in Kentucky on October 2, 1943, and attended junior high and high school in Cedar Falls, Iowa. She is married to Kenneth Coleman, a political scientist specializing in Latin America and a native of Cedar Rapids, Iowa. They have one son, Jonathan.

Iowa's Department of Intercollegiate Athletics recognized as a CHAMPS "Program of Excellence"

The University of Iowa was one of four NCAA member institutions honored with the prestigious CHAMPS Program of Excellence award at the annual Division 1A Directors' Association meeting in Dallas in September. Joining Iowa was Arizona State University, Michigan State University and the University of Notre Dame.

The "Program of Excellence" is a lifetime award designed to recognize Division 1A athletics programs that have established student athlete welfare as the cornerstone of their operating principles. The Program of Excellence serves as an assessment tool for universities that are seeking to improve programs and services for student athletes. Secondly, it establishes a "standard of excellence" that will serve as a model for Division 1A CHAMPS/Life Skills Programs. Finally, it honors universities that have made a commitment to a broad program of student athlete support services, as defined by the Division 1A CHAMPS Program.

"CHAMPS" Challenging Athletes' Minds for Personal Success- a program sponsored by the NCAA Division 1A Athletic Directors' Association is designed to address the "total development" of the student athlete. "Preparation for Life" is its commitment.



The University of Iowa has a long-standing commitment to the growth and development of its student athletes. Its Office of Athletic Student Services was created in the mid 70s and its life skills programming began shortly after.

Through the years, the department's programming efforts have assisted in graduating Iowa student athletes' ten percentage points or more above the general student body. At 75%, department's graduation rates also place it among the leaders in the Big Ten Conference.

In the early 80s the Department of Intercollegiate Athletics adopted a theme to reflect its commitment to the overall development of Iowa student athletes. "Today's Hawkeyes are Tomorrow's Leaders" is the theme around which all services to Iowa athletes are developed. With this theme in mind, the athletic department encourages its student athletes to assume leadership roles in the community and on campus, and to obtain meaningful practical experiences that prepare them for life after college and athletics. This theme is articulated to all that visit the Iowa Athletic Department including prospective student athletes. It is also a catalyst for meaningful discussions between student athletes and athletic administration about improving the quality of life and opportunities for Iowa student athletes.

The CHAMPS program consists of five vital components:

1. The commitment to academic excellence
2. The commitment to athletic excellence
3. The commitment to personal development
4. The commitment to service
5. The commitment to career development

Carver-Hawkeye Arena

Carver-Hawkeye Arena, one of the 10 largest university owned facilities in the nation, serves as Iowa's home basketball arena. Opened in January of 1983, the building seats 15,500 for basketball.

Capacity crowds have been the rule rather than the exception at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Over four million fans have viewed games in Carver-Hawkeye Arena the past 17 and-a-half seasons. Iowa played 60 consecutive home games in front of sellout crowds. The single game record of 15,570 was set against Indiana in 1987.

The Hawkeyes have won nearly 80 percent (217-59, .786) of their home games since the building opened. Iowa had a 15-game home court winning streak in 1986-87 and won 43 straight non-conference home games prior to a 79-76 loss to NCAA runner-up Duke during the 1994 season. Iowa is 108-9 (.923) in non-conference games in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The multipurpose facility also serves as home to Hawkeye wrestling, gymnastics and volleyball and has been the site of numerous concerts, commencements, sports camps and other events.

Fans enjoy an unobstructed view from each of the theatre seats. The building won a design award from the American Institute of Architects in 1984.

In a poll of 70 members of the media Carver-Hawkeye Arena was voted as the top arena in the Big Ten. The Iowa pep band and the media section in Carver-Hawkeye were also voted best in the league.

Named for the late Roy Carver, a longtime supporter of the University, the building has 20,000 square feet of floor space when the lower level seats are retracted. The 42 rows of seating are divided in 28 lettered sections. A 100-seat press section for print and radio is located in sections AA-BB.

Connected to the Arena is an athletic office building, which is four levels high and occupies over 60,000 square feet. Athletic department coaches and administrators have offices in the building.

The arena features six locker rooms, including the permanent men's basketball locker room, along with fully-equipped weight and training facilities.

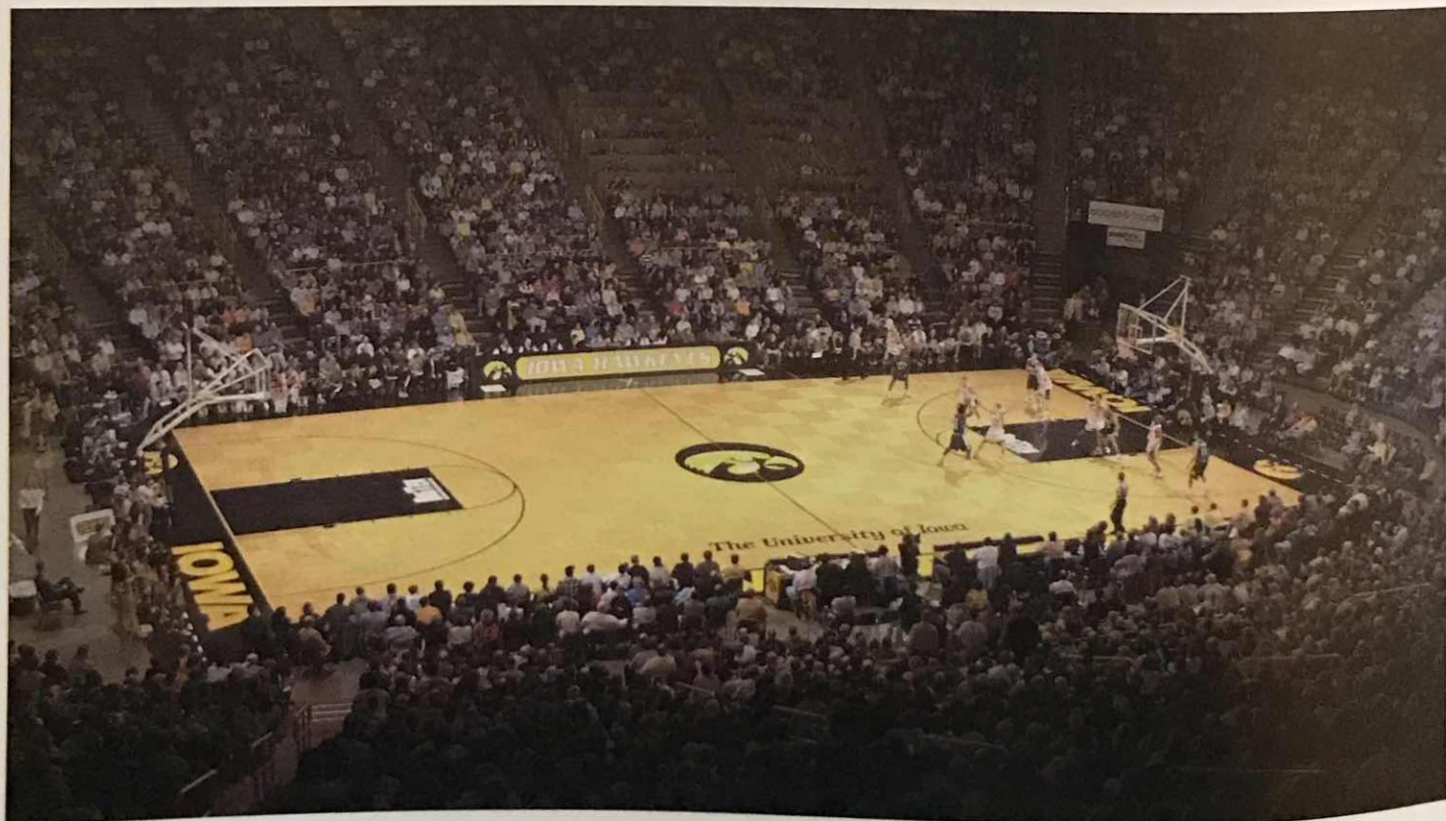


Arena are new scoreboards and video walls which were installed just prior to the 1996 season. The state-of-the-art equipment features two video walls with live action and instant replay capabilities, a message center and up-to-date player and game statistics.

The Arena cost \$18,402,962 to build and was completed in three years. It was financed with private contributions from Hawkeye athletic department supporters. The first event in the Arena was the 1983 wrestling dual vs. Oklahoma (a 357 Iowa victory). The initial basketball game was a 61-59 loss to Michigan State in January, 1983.

Carver-Hawkeye Arena has hosted the Big Ten and NCAA wrestling championships and Big Ten and NCAA regional and national gymnastics championships. The 1984 U.S. Olympic wrestling trials were held there, as was the National Duals wrestling tournament in 1998 and 1999. Iowa hosted the 1994 NCAA wrestling championships, in which the Hawkeyes won the national crown while setting tournament attendance records.

The 1983 Iowa-Iowa State wrestling match attracted a national-record 15,283 fans. Iowa won the meet 26-11.





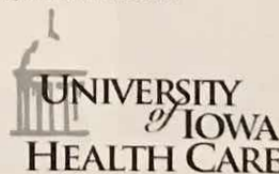

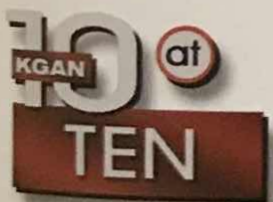

Bob Bowlsby, in his 10th year as director of men's athletics at The University of Iowa, heads a team of coaches and athletic staff members that has led Iowa athletics to rank among the nation's best.

As the chief administrator for Iowa's men's athletic department, Bowlsby has earned a reputation as one of the most highly-respected, energetic and ambitious athletic administrators in the nation. His hiring of new head coaches in football, basketball and wrestling, all in the past three years, will enable Iowa to maintain its standing as one of the most visible and successful Division I athletic programs.

A Waterloo native, Bowlsby became Iowa's 10th Athletic Director in June, 1991 after serving in the same role at the University of Northern Iowa since 1984. He previously served as Assistant Athletic Director for Facilities at Northern Iowa.

Bowlsby earned his bachelor's degree from Moorhead State University (Minnesota) in 1975 and his master's degree from the University of Iowa in 1978.



Bowlsby has served as chair of the Big Ten Championships and Awards committee, as a member of the league's Conference and National Structure committee and was appointed as one of two Big Ten representatives to the NCAA Management Council. Bowlsby was elected to chair the Management Council for the first two years of its existence.

Bowlsby managed five NCAA Wrestling Championships as chair of the Wrestling Committee and has served on NCAA committees on Financial Aid and Amateurism, the Special Committee to Review

Amateurism Issues and the Special Committee to Review Financial Conditions in Athletics. Bob serves as an Executive Committee member with both the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics and the Division I-A Athletic Directors Association and will serve as President of the I-A Directors group during the 2001-02 school year.

This summer Bowlsby began a four-year term on the NCAA Division I Basketball Tournament Committee.

In 1995 he was elected chair of the NCAA Olympic Sports Liaison Committee and represented the NCAA as one of two voting members on the United States Olympic Committee. Bowlsby also was appointed by former United States Olympic Committee President LeRoy Walker to the NCAA/USOC Liaison Committee, chaired by George Steinbrenner and NCAA Executive Director Cedrick Dempsey.

Bowlsby is a charter member of the Iowa Olympics Committee and a member of the Board of Directors of the Iowa Games. Bob is a board member of the Iowa Scholarship Fund, Inc. and the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. He was the Waterloo-Cedar Falls Jaycees Boss of the Year in 1986.

Bob and his wife, Candice, have four children: Lisa, Matt, Rachel and Kyle. Bowlsby was born on January 10, 1952.

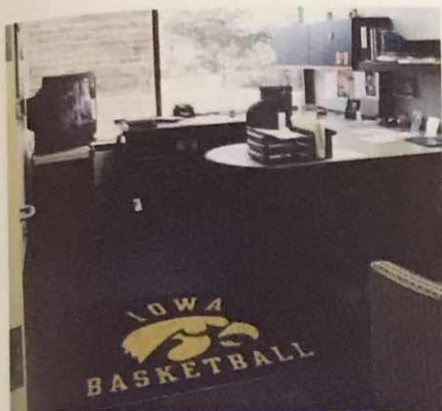

The Hawkeye Visions Endowment Program:

Investing in a Winning Future, has a \$25 million goal, to create permanently endowed scholarships for all starting positions in UI Athletics. The program currently includes approximately 50 fully endowed scholarships, 35 partially endowed scholarships, 20 scholarships which are in the development stages and 25 future scholarship commitments.

The following scholarships are fully endowed awards (\$125,000 minimum) which are currently dedicated to the UI men's basketball program. Other sport scholarships, partial scholarships, awards being developed and/or planned are not included in this list.

Beth and Bob Allsop Point Guard Scholarship

Beth and Bob Allsop of Cedar Rapids, IA created the first endowed position scholarship for Hawkeye basketball with a leadership gift in 1999. The Allsops have been season-ticket holders and active supporters of Iowa basketball for more than 35 years.

The Berman Family of Fairfield, IA established their endowed scholarship in 2000. The Bermans are enthusiastic Hawkeye basketball fans, along with their son Ari, a former Iowa basketball ball boy, and daughter Ali.

Warren and Harriet are both members of the Presidents Club at the UI Foundation and support various UI and civic programs. The 2000-01 Berman recipient is Sean Sonderleiter.

John and Mary Ann Colloton Basketball Scholarship

The Colloton Basketball Scholarship, along with similar scholarships in football, women's basketball and wrestling, was established in 1998 by a generous gift from longtime Hawkeye fans John and Mary Ann Colloton of Iowa City.

Tom and Shari Davis Basketball Manager Scholarship

Tom Davis, Iowa's head basketball coach from 1987-99, and his wife Shari, established this scholarship in 1991, which goes each year to the senior manager on the basketball managerial staff.

Davis led Iowa to 10 post-season tournaments, including eight NCAA tournament appearances. The 1999 Hawkeyes were his 3rd Iowa team to reach the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16. The 2000-01 Davis recipient is Quinn Collins.

Dr. Brent and Lynette Feller Basketball Scholarship

Brent and Lynette Feller of Cedar Rapids, IA established their endowed scholarship in 1999. Dr. Feller is an anesthesiologist and holds two UI degrees (1982 B.S. and 1987 M.D.). Lynette has been a nurse and currently is a cosmetologist.

The Fellers support a variety of UI athletic projects and enjoy traveling to away football and basketball games. The 2000-01 Feller recipient is Reggie Evans.

Ailene lives in Iowa City and supports a variety of civic and UI causes. She received a Distinguished Alumni Award from the UI in 1999. The 2000-01 Liechty recipient is Rod Thompson.

Brad and Anne Lohaus Basketball Scholarship

Brad and Anne Lohaus established an endowed scholarship in 1990, following Brad's third season in the NBA. A native of Glendale, AZ, Lohaus played for the Hawkeyes from 1983-87.

Lohaus was drafted by the Boston Celtics and enjoyed a prosperous career in professional basketball. Brad earned his degree from the University of Iowa in 1990.

Anne, a Humboldt native, earned her degree from Iowa's College of Pharmacy in 1983. Anne and Brad, and children Wyatt and Tanner, reside in Iowa City. The 2000-01 Lohaus recipient is Jared Reiner.

Catherine Nacke Cooper Basketball Scholarship

Catherine Cooper, a native of Rolfe, Iowa, established this scholarship with a generous gift in 1995. Cooper is a 1936 graduate of the University of Iowa with a B.A. in communications and theatre arts.

She is an enthusiastic sports fan and was a four-time club champion golfer in Carlsbad, New Mexico. Cooper currently resides in Marshalltown and has one daughter and three grandchildren. The 2000-01 Cooper recipient is Brody Boyd.

Frank "Bucky" O'Connor Basketball Scholarship

The Bucky O'Connor Scholarship fund has an endowment large enough to fund both a basketball and golf scholarship.

O'Connor coached the Iowa basketball team from 1951 until he died in an automobile accident in April, 1958.

His Hawkeye teams twice won the Big Ten championship and finished second on two other occasions. Iowa placed fourth in the nation in 1955 and second in the nation in 1956. The 2000-01 O'Connor recipient is Glen Worley.

Chris Street Basketball Scholarship

The Chris Street endowment was established with a generous gift from the Christopher Street Memorial Foundation and increases each year with the proceeds from an annual golf tournament.

Street, a native of Indianola, Iowa, died in an auto accident January 19, 1993, midway through his junior season. A hard-nosed competitor, Street started as a true freshman for the Hawkeyes and was on pace to rank among Iowa's all-time leaders in both scoring and rebounding. The 2000-01 Street recipient is Duez Henderson.

John Streif Basketball Scholarship

The John Streif Scholarship, was established in 1994 by the Iowa Varsity Club, with a portion of the proceeds from the Farm Scholarship Game and continues to grow each year through gifts from letterwinners and fans.

Streif, assistant athletic trainer and travel coordinator at Iowa, joined the staff in 1972. Streif, a native of Manchester, Iowa, earned his bachelor's degree in therapeutic recreation from Iowa in 1970. The 2000-01 Streif recipient is Jason Smith.
