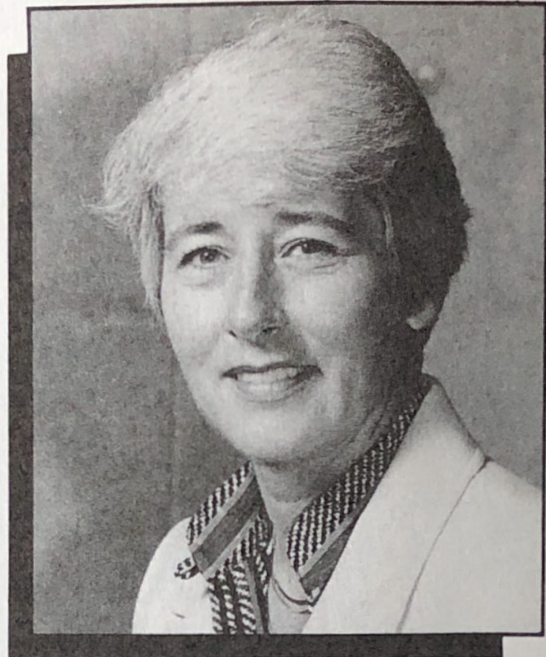
It will be a biggie. That's the word around the Big Ten about tonight's match-up between Illinois and Iowa. Both teams appear in Associated Press' Top 20. Both are unbeaten in league play. Both sport outstanding individual players. And, most important, both have their sights set on their first Big Ten Conference championship.

Coach C. Vivian Stringer's Hawkeye squad, unbeaten in three league games, carries a 10-3 overall record into the contest. Coach Laura Golden's Illinois team owns a 4-0 Big Ten record and is 11-2 overall.

The Fighting Illini's attack is built around 6-3 center Jonelle Polk. Already the second-leading scorer in Illinois history, Polk, a first-team all-Big Ten pick a year ago, has been truly dominating in this her final year at Illinois. She's the team leader in scoring, rebounding, minutes played and blocked shots. She recently scored a career-high 37 points in the Illini's victory over Nebraska.

Illinois is far from a one dimensional team, however. Angie McClellan, a junior forward out of Chicago, also sports a double-digit scoring average while Jenny Johnson runs the offense — 52 assists prior to last weekend's Big Ten games — from the point guard position.

The Hawkeyes are on a roll. They've won five in a row and nine of their last 10. Iowa's most recent victories have been lopsided affairs: an 81-40 defeat of Minnesota, a 68-49 win over ninth-rated Louisiana State, a 72-61 victory at Northwestern and an 83-44 defeat of Wisconsin in the Big Ten season opener.

Balanced scoring and strong defensive play has sparked the recent winning streak. Three or more players have scored in double figures in each of the aforementioned victories while the Hawkeye defense has limited those opponents to just 36 percent success from the field (83-of-230). Both LSU and Minnesota were held to season low scoring totals.

Michelle Edwards, Iowa's first-team all-Big Ten selection of a year ago, continues to be Iowa's leading scorer, 17.2 ppg, while Lisa Long, a second-team all-Big Ten pick last season, holds down the team lead in rebounding, 9.7 rpg. Lisa Becker is chipping in 10.8 points and an even 7.0 rebounds per contest. Long (12.5) and Tricia Blair (10.3) are the other Hawkeyes scoring in double figures.

Illinois holds a 10-7 lead in the series and won the last game played between the two schools, 78-68, last March in Champaign, Ill. Iowa won last year's game here in Carver-Hawkeye Arena 74-57 and has won four of the last five meetings.

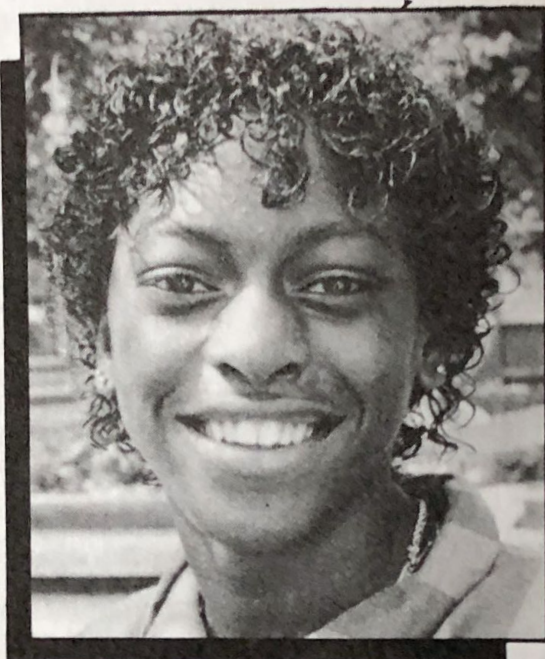

Last year: Explosive perimeter player saw action in first 13 games, including four Big Ten contests, before being sidelined at the start of the second semester . . . hit for season scoring high of eight on three occasions: vs. Bradley in the Amana-Hawkeye Classic, at Western Kentucky, and against Penn State . . . best outing came at Western Kentucky where she sank 4 of 6 field goal attempts and added one rebound and assist in just 11 minutes . . . averaged 3.9 points and 1.8 rebounds.

In high school: First-team USA Today, second-team Parade prep all-America joined Hawkeye guard corps after outstanding senior season at Jamaica Plain High School in Boston, Mass . . . one of 75 high school standouts mentioned in National Coach magazine's all-America team . . . averaged 41.6 points per game last year, the nation's best in the five-player game . . . also averaged 18 rebounds and 4.5 steals per contest while shooting 55 percent from the field and 80 percent from the charity stripe . . . scored 2,322 points during her prep career, breaking the Massachusetts

girls' scoring record of 2,091 established by former AAU teammate and fellow Hawkeye, Michelle Edwards . . . a three-time all-Metro and four-time all-city selection, she scored 65 of Jamaica Plain's 78 points in its victory over Dorchester High last season . . . signed with Iowa during the early signing period after verbally committing shortly after her campus visit.

HEAD COACH

C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Entering her fourth season as head coach of the University of Iowa women's basketball program is C. Vivian Stringer, the winningest coach in school history and the only coach to lead the Hawkeyes to a 20-victory season and into post-season competition.

Stringer begins the 1986-87 season with a remarkable career record of 310-76 (.803), a mark which includes a three-year record at Iowa of 59-25 (.702) and a 40-14 (.741) ledger against Big Ten Conference opponents.

An examination of the Hawkeyes' performances year-by-year under the former head coach of Cheyney State College clearly reveals the development of one of the nation's top programs. Stringer's first Iowa team, the 1983-84 squad, won 17 games, two more than the previous two Hawkeye squads had won total.

In 1984-85 the Hawkeyes reached the 20-victory plateau for the first time in school history. Last year's squad continued the upward trend by winning 22 games — including a school record 15 contests with league opponents — and receiving an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament, another first for the Iowa program.

At the heart of Stringer's success is the recruitment of only the very best players in the nation. The 1986-87 roster includes 11 players who received all-America honors as high school seniors. Of those, six will have played on national or international teams sponsored by the Amateur Basketball Association of the United States of America by the start of practice for the 1986-87 season.

In fact, Iowa, defending national champion Texas and runner-up Southern California were the only schools to place three players on the United States' top two international teams for 1986.

Stringer's presence in the Hawkeye state has resulted in success in two other significant areas as well:

— Iowa is firmly established as one of the nation's leaders in attendance and currently



boasts the NCAA attendance record for a single game as well as the top two attended games in Big Ten Conference history.

— 1985-86 marked the first season in Iowa history which the Hawkeyes were ranked among the nation's Top Twenty from start to finish. The Hawkeyes peaked at No. 12 in Associated Press' listing for the week of March 4.

Stringer was named 1985 NCAA District V Coach of the Year following the 1984-85 season. She also was tabbed coach of the United States' entry to the 1985 World University Games in Kobe, Japan. The Americans took home a silver medal, losing only to a much older and experienced Soviet Union team in the championship game.

Stringer received a bachelor of science degree from Slippery Rock University in 1971 and a master's degree in education the following year. She was inducted into her alma mater's Hall of Fame in 1985 as one of its "Outstanding Alumni."

A native of Edenborn, Pa., Stringer was born March 16, 1948. She is married to William D. Stringer. The couple have three children, seven-year-old David, five-year-old Janine, and two-year-old Justin.

ASSISTANTS



JENNIFER BEDNAREK

Returning for her fourth season at The University of Iowa as assistant to C. Vivian Stringer is Jennifer Bednarek, a former standout guard at Penn State University.

Bednarek came to the Iowa program from Wichita State University where she was assistant coach of the women's basketball program. She coached at WSU for two years following a two-year stint as graduate assistant/assistant coach at Southern Illinois University.

A three-year starter at Penn State, Bednarek led the Lady Lions in scoring for three years and was named to the Kodak All-East, All-American team her final two seasons. She received her bachelor's degree from Penn State in 1980.



MARIANNA FREEMAN

Continuing a long and prosperous association with C. Vivian Stringer is Marianna Freeman, who came to The University of Iowa three years ago to work as assistant coach of the women's basketball program. Freeman was coached by Stringer while attending Cheyney State College in the late 1970s. She captained the 1979 Cheyney State team which went unbeaten.

Freeman came to Iowa from Delaware State College where she was head coach. While at DSC, Freeman guided the Hornets to several upper-division finishes in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference.

Freeman received her bachelor's degree from Cheyney State in 1979.

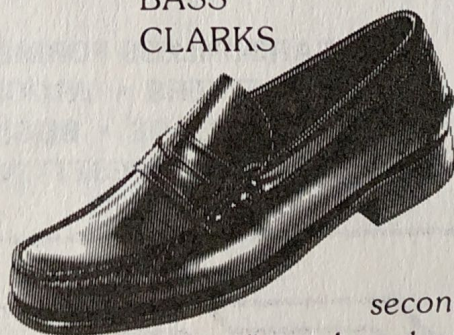

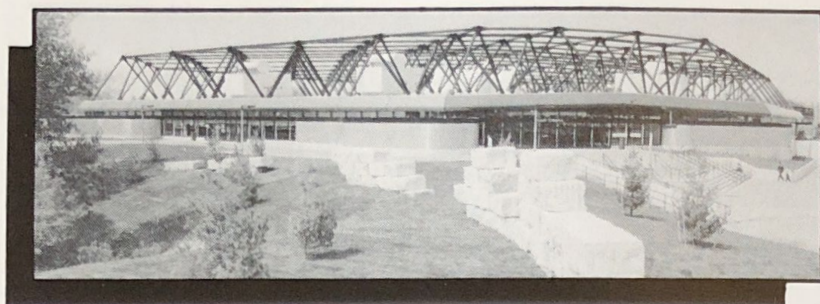
