

TODAY'S GAME

No. 23 Iowa vs. Minnesota

Friday, January 25, 1991 Carver-Hawkeye Arena

TONIGHT -- The 23rd-ranked University of Iowa women's basketball team begins a three-game homestand tonight against Minnesota. The Hawkeyes are 8-6 overall and 2-3 in the Big Ten Conference. Minnesota stands 4-12 and 0-6.

IOWA LAST WEEK -- The Hawkeyes split a pair of Big Ten road games, falling to Indiana for the first time in 11 contests, 74-59 in Bloomington, Ind., January 18, and defeating Ohio State for the third consecutive outing, 88-68 in Columbus, Ohio. LaTonya Tate scored a career-high 15 points against Indiana. Senior Stephanie Schueler poured in a season-high 20 points, including 17 in the second half, to lead the Hawkeyes against Ohio State. Toni Foster contributed 16 points, while Tate and Necole Tunsil each chipped in 14.

SCOUTING THE GOPHERS - Firstyear head coach Linda Hill-MacDonald's Minnesota team will be looking for its first Big Ten Conference win of the year when it tips it up against Iowa tonight. The Gophers are paced by senior Ellen Kramer, who boasts an 18.3 point and 8.0 rebound per game average. Three other Gophers are scoring in double figures, led by Carol Ann Shudlick's 13.1 points per game. Dana Joubert and Stacy Carver contribute 11.3 and 10.4 points per contest.

IOWA VS. MINNESOTA -- Iowa leads its series with Minnesota 16-11, has won the last 13 straight, and is 13-1 with C. Vivian Stringer as head coach. Last season Iowa defeated the Gophers 79-43 in Minneapolis and 87-58 in Iowa City.

THE LAST TIME -- Franthea Price led three Hawkeyes in double figures, scoring 24 points, as Iowa defeated Minnesota in Iowa City 87-58. Stephanie Schueler tallied 14 and Jolette Law added 10 for Iowa. Jodi Olson led the Minnesota attack with 19 points.

FABULOUS FRESHMEN -- Iowa's highly touted freshman class of six has made substantial contributions in the team's first 14 games. As a group, the six average 16.1 points, 9.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.2 steals per game. They average 9.5 minutes of court time per player and three, Necole Tunsil, Tia Jackson and Andrea Harmon, have seen time in starting roles.

AROUND THE BIG TEN -- In other match-ups around the Big Ten tonight, Illinois plays at Wisconsin, Ohio State travels to Michigan, Indiana takes on Michigan State in East Lansing, and No. 6 Purdue challenges No. 14 Northwestern in Evanston.



THE IOWA HEAD COACH C. Vivian Stringer



How does one describe C. Vivian Stringer? Perhaps you tell how in seven years she has raised Iowa from the bottom of the Big Ten standings to the top of the nation's polls. Or, you mention that since her arrival in the Hawkeve state

attendance at Iowa games has increased 2,750 times over.

Do you tell of the endless hours she spends in front of a video machine dissecting an opponent's gameplan, or of the many charitable organizations to which she donates her time? Should you point out her husband and three young children, or direct your attention to the 16 young women whom she has brought together in the Hawkeye family?

It's simplest to use the words dreams, belief, warmth, excitement, commitment, and success to describe Stringer and the accomplishments she brings to the Iowa program. Perhaps her coaching peers said it all in one gesture--when they chose Stringer as the 1988 Converse National Coach of the Year.

The Hawkeyes' dynamic head coach finished the 1989-90 season with a remarkable career record of 415-94 (.815). a mark that includes a seven-year record at Iowa of 164-43 (.792) and an 105-21 (.833) ledger against Big Ten Conference opponents. Stringer's 415 wins is the fifth-highest total in the profession today and her .815 win percentage is the nation's best for coaches with better than 250 victories. She is the only coach to ever lead two schools to a number two or better ranking on the Associated Press poll.

Among the most respected women's basketball coaches in the nation, Stringer has received numerous awards but none more prestigious than the 1988 Converse Coach of the Year honor and the 1982 NCAA Division I Coach of the

Year award. She was also named the 1988 and 1985 NCAA District V Coach of the Year.

Stringer has been chosen to coach the United States women's basketball team in the 1991 Pan-American Games competition. In the summer of 1989, she was chosen to coach the United States entry to the World Championship Zone Qualification Tournament in Sao Paulo, Brazil, In 1985, she coached the United States' entry to the World University Games in Kobe, Japan. In 1979 she coached in Mexico and in 1981 she toured China as head coach of the United States Select Team. She also coached in the 1982 National Sports Festival in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Also an active administrator, Stringer was instrumental in the development of the National Women's Basketball Coaches Association. She currently is a voting board member of the Amateur Basketball Association of the United States of America and the Nike Shoe Company Coaches Advisory Board. In 1987, Stringer began a three-year appointment as the Big Ten Conference's representative to the NCAA Division I Mideast Basketball Committee.

A native of Edenborn, Pennsylvania, and a member of the Alumni Hall of Fame at her alma mater, Slippery Rock State College, Stringer is married to William D. Stringer. The couple has three children, 11 year-old David, Janine, age ten, and six-year-old Justin.

Marianna Freeman



Continuing a long and prosperous association with C. Vivian Stringer is Marianna Freeman, who is in her eighth year as a Hawkeye assistant coach. Freeman was coached by Stringer and cap-

tained the 1979 Cheyney State team that was unbeaten in 25 games.

Freeman was head coach at Delaware State College from 1981-83, before joining the Hawkeyes. Under her direction, the DSC program moved from the cellar of the Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference to the league's upper division.

Angie Lee



Second-year assistant Angie Lee is no stranger to the Iowa program -- she was a senior captain of C. Vivian Stringer's first Hawkeye squad.

Lee is also no stranger to Stringer's coaching technique.

From 1985-1987, Lee served as the graduate assistant coach of the Iowa team that advanced to two NCAA postseason tournaments and consecutively set school records for wins in a season. Lee served as the assistant basketball coach at Western Illinois from 1987-1989 before returning to Iowa.

Linda Myers



Linda Myers is in her second season as an assistant coach at The University of Iowa after successful stints at Slippery Rock, Eastern Kentucky and Florida International.

A native of Jackson

Center, Pennsylvania, Myers began her coaching career as the assistant at Florida International in 1981. The following season, she returned to her alma mater Slippery Rock as the graduate assistant coach and a master's degree student. Myers served for four years, 1983-87, as the assistant coach at Eastern Kentucky, before returning to Slippery Rock as the assistant coach in 1987.

Jenny Lin Benson



Jenny Lin Benson, a standout guard at the University of Alaska- Fairbanks, joins the Iowa program as a graduate assistant coach.

Benson was was a four-time Continental Divide Conference

all-academic selection, as well as a CoSIDA academic all-American. She holds 11 individual Alaska-Fairbanks records, including all of the three-point categories, assists and steals. Benson graduated magna cum laude from UAF in 1988. An NCAA postgraduate scholar, she is pursuing a master's degree in athletic administration at Iowa.



HAWKEYE SPOTLIGHT Becky Shrigley

Some things just seem to run in the family. For Becky Shrigley's family it's basketball. Her brother, Richard is a former Boston College player and Virginia Tech assistant coach, and her uncle, Norm Sloan coaches professionally overseas. In addition, Becky's sister Kim is married to Iowa men's assistant coach Bruce Pearl.

Shrigley says her brother's collegiate basketball experience was a strong influence in deciding to attend the University of Iowa.

"He told me about the time demands on Division I athletes. Now I'm finding out about what my brother went through when he was in college, and we can talk about it more. It helps me hang in there sometimes," comments Shrigley.

Shrigley's association with the coaching profession helps her on the court too.
"I know the game well in terms of thinking it through, running the patterns, and knowing where everyone is supposed to be. I can see things developing on the court. I think that is one of my strengths as a player."

Having her sister and brother-in-law living near also helped her leap into big-time college athletics. "If I want to get away from the dorms, or school, I can go over there and it is like a home. It would be harder without them here."

Shrigley says the Iowa team is very much like a close family. Accordingly, another major influence on Shrigley's life is the head of that family, Coach C. Vivian Stringer.

"Coach Stringer has taught me more about life in general than I ever thought possible. There aren't many coaches who take time out to teach you lessons about life. She is really concerned about us as people. She has taught me about realizing who I want to be, and what it takes to set and realize my goals."

According to Shrigley, Stringer has taught her a thing or two about basketball as well. "She is really motivational. Coach Stringer really fires me up for a game and makes me want to dunk when I get out there. Just the way she says things makes you want to play. There is a real passion and intensity about her before a game. You can see it in her eyes."

Shrigley takes Stringer's lessons about setting and achieving goals to heart in her game preparation.

"I mentally picture what I want to do on the court. I just have to look at what I'm capable of doing, and try to use what I have to the best of my ability."

An academic all-Big Ten selection as a sophomore, Shrigley has set medical school as a future goal for herself. One step toward realizing that goal is completing her undergraduate degree in biology.

Who knows? Maybe in her study of genetics, Shrigley will come across the answer to why some things just happen to run in the family.



COAST TO COAST COVERAGE

The Iowa women's basketball program has moved into the national spotlight and into the national headlines. Over the years, the Hawkeyes have been featured in such national publications as Sports Illustrated, USA Today, the New York Times, the Los Angeles Times, and the Chicago Tribune. The national television networks CBS, NBC, CNN, and ESPN have each produced features on the nationally ranked Hawkeyes.

WHO Radio of Des Moines, Iowa, has been an annual broadcaster of the Hawkeye home and away contests and will continue the live play-by-play coverage in 1990-91. Several of Iowa's games will also be broadcast by KRUI Radio of Iowa City.

Iowa has played on national, regional, and statewide television in each of the past seven years and will to do so again in 1990-91.




Carver-Hawkeye Arena is home to The University of Iowa women's basketball.

Located on the western edge of the campus, the \$18-million structure is the largest addition to what has developed into one of the nation's finest athletics complexes. Within walking distance of the Arena are Kinnick Stadium, the Iowa Field Hockey Field, the Iowa Baseball Field, the Hawkeye Softball Complex, the UI Recreation Building, the Klotz Tennis Center, Finkbine Field Golf

Course, Cretzmeyer Track and Field, and the Indoor Practice Facility.


